


EDUCATION TEAM REVIEW 2025

17 **Joseph Coelho Poetry Play Kits** were donated to St Cuthbert's Infants, St Benedict's Junior, Shepton Mallet Infants and Wookey Primary School.

St Aldhelm's Primary, Butleigh School and Bishop Henderson School each brought a small group of pupils to Waterstones in Wells. They had a wonderful time exploring the Children's Section, ably assisted by David from Waterstones and some of our team. The children left with their chosen books up to the value of £20 each to take home and devour. This was entirely funded by Wells Festival of Literature.

Our Year 6 Event is one of the highlights of Wells Festival of Literature. This year award-winning writer Sam Sedgman, author of *The Clockwork Conspiracy*, proved an enormous hit with more than 1,000 youngsters, over four sessions in Cedars Hall. He told entertaining tales of how the grandfather clock of his childhood and a trip with his father to see Big Ben inspired him to write both the thriller, and its successor *The Forbidden Atlas*. The Festival funded all costs, including transport, so that the event was totally free to all schools. Youngsters bought more than 2,000 books at a substantial discount, subsidised by the Festival and by publishers Macmillan and Bloomsbury. We were also visited by the High Sheriff of Somerset, Janet Montgomery and the Mayor of Wells, Louis Agabani.

OTHER NEWS



Kings Academy Book Vending Machine

We attended the launch of the book vending machine at Kings Academy in Cheddar to which we contributed half the cost. The machine holds 150 books and is activated by counters which the pupils receive as rewards or incentives.

Coram Beanstalk

In 2025 we funded 15 Coram reading helpers in 7 local schools. These specially trained volunteers work in-person with individual children in a low-pressure setting. They focus on helping children to want to read as well as improving reading attainment.

Schools Book Clubs

The Schools Book Clubs make reading a fun social activity. The children meet termly to discuss plots, characters and themes of their chosen book. Sharing views, discussing new genres and suggesting books all build confidence and a love of reading. This year we read Somerset Tsunami by Emma Carroll, Meticulous Jones and the Skull Tattoo by Philippa Leathley and Listen to the Moon by Michael Morpurgo. All books were funded by WFL.


